The Chairman opened the meeting, welcomed everyone and invited the members of the public to speak. Mrs. Inder from Mill Meadow had come to object to the plan 23/2278/13/F The replacement of a bungalow in the road with two two storey houses. She said they would be too dominant and taller than the neighbouring houses (the | old School House) blocking their winter sunlight. There was also a problem with surface drainage. After further discussion she and her companion left the meeting.

<u>Planning.</u> Parish Council recommendations.

23/2278/13/F – Mill Meadow, Harbertonford. Replacement of dwelling with 2 new dwellings.

After discussions Cllr. Padfield proposed the Parish Council should object to the plans :-

- 1.As too high and dominant next to the Old School House and School House, the ridge line being too tall.
- 2. Overbearing on neighbouring bungalows behind and stealing their winter sunlight.
- 3. Existing plans lack SW elevations for plot 2 and missing montage.

Seconded by Cllr. Clayton. Voting 8 in favour, 1 against.

- 17-23/2323/13/F Beenleigh Meadows Farm, Harberton. Retrospective application for agricultural buildings and improvement of farm access. It was proposed by Cllr. Williams, seconded by Cllr. Trott to object to this plan :-
- 1.No obvious agricultural justification.
- 2.Lack of hygienic facilities.
- 3. Plans give insufficient detail. Voting 6 in favour, 2 abstentions 1, against.

The Chairman reported there had been a fallen tree trapped by Harbertonford bridge in the river. This had now been cleared away thanks to several local residents. To whom many thanks – Cllr. Peter Beamish, also Len Lewis, Neil Palmer and Dennis Treeby
