TRAYE – Funding Application

The cost of the service to the various Parishes is around £6000 pa each. Harberton Parish Council currently offers £500 towards this cost, which is much appreciated. A number of costs have increased this year not least the financial effect of the status of all Youth Workers being changed from a self employed basis to an Employed status.

The continued running of the service has relied and will continue to rely on successful funding from 1 major funder every year, to fill the gap. TRAYE currently has been successful in its bid to the National Lottery which will fund Traye to the extent of £58,000 over the next 3 years. This required a huge effort and therefore some cost in order to pass the very high bars laid down for this level of funding.

We are also very fortunate to have a number of individual Councillors who support Traye from their Locality budgets – about £7000 pa and we also manage to secure various other smaller elements of funding during the year. However this is a somewhat precarious situation for such an important service and therefore the Trustees have looked at putting the Organisation onto a more secure footing.

The Trustees therefore believe that the best way to secure the continuation of the services is to ask Councils to support a higher proportion of the cost of the service. Currently Buckfastleigh who joined Traye recently do pay on a full cost basis – a condition of joining.

I raised the problem with Staverton Parish Council and as a result they have agreed to increase their payment to £2500 for next year subject to other Councils being prepared to increase their contribution. Subsequently Dartington have also agreed.

Request: That Harberton Council increase their support to £2500 p.a.

I would ask for this item to be on your next appropriate Council Agenda.

I would be happy to attend your meeting to answer any questions if you think it required.
